Pastor Dave's Corner:

"The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against such things." Galatians 5:22-23 (NRSV)

As I'm writing this, I realized it was a year ago that I was writing my first Pastor's Corner. It's hard to believe I've already been with you a year. I want to thank everyone for their love, support, and patience.

I first learned of my appointment here in early February. At that time, my plan and hope were, over the course of my first year, to get to know everyone, visit those who were home bound, and introduce myself to many of the business folks in the community. But then the pandemic hit. As a result, I feel like I've only half experienced what a first year must be like in a new appointment.

Recently, a prayer request was lifted up for those going off to college for the first time. I added to that request prayers for those returning for their sophomore year. My thought was, many of those sophomore's probably only half experienced their freshmen year. I imagine for some, there were no inperson classes, on campus housing, or in-person dining.

This led me to think about patience. It's one of the fruits of the Spirit that St. Paul lists in his letter to the Galatians. The fruits of the Spirit are qualities that the Spirit nurtures in us.

I know for me, patience can be a challenge. Especially in this technological age where the potential for 24-7 communication has led many to an expectation of instant gratification. Who wants to wait? For many, it's diminished our capacity to persevere and endure in the midst of long-suffering. The pandemic, especially, has taught us something about patience or the lack thereof.

Patience is waiting through faith with hope and confidence. It's that moment when we finally realize, there's nothing we can do—it's out of our control. No amount of worry or anxiety will change things. All we can do is patiently wait on God to reveal to us in time God's plan.

The Holy Spirit nurtures in believers a sense of patience by helping us understand how God is patient with us. Scripture tells us that God is slow to anger and abounds in steadfast love. Over and over, God's people turned away from God but God's love never failed. God never gave up on them and God doesn't give up on us. God is patient!

We've heard stories throughout the pandemic about impatience. Impatience between mask and non-mask wearers, advocates for in-person and virtual schooling, and now, between the COVID vaccinated and non-vaccinated. In times like these, patience is more important than ever to ensure we turn the other cheek rather than resort to "tit for tat". Patience is an ability to not overreact, to be restrained in the face of provocation, to take a pause in a heated moment, to take a long view.

The pandemic has tried my patience as I'm sure it has for some of you. But what has helped me is to remember how Jesus showed patience—through forgiveness, compassion, inclusion, acceptance, and love. Patience with his disciples, patience with sinners, and ultimately, patience with those that crucified him.

May the Holy Spirit continue to bless us with patience, as we continue to move forward through this uncertain pandemic-time into the post-pandemic future.



ZUCCHINI BREAD

Ingredients:

3 eggs
1 c. oil
2 tsp. vanilla
2 c. sugar
2 c. zucchini
1 c. crushed pineapple, well drained
3 c. flour
2 tsp. baking soda
1 tsp. salt
1 tsp. cinnamon
½ tsp. nutmeg
1 cup walnuts chopped
1 c. raisins

Directions:

Mix together flour, baking soda, salt, cinnamon, and nutmeg, set aside. Beat eggs until creamy, add oil, sugar, and vanilla until thick and foamy. Stir in zucchini and pineapple. Add dry ingredients, nuts and raisins. Stir until mixed well. Pour into greased floured bread pans. Bake at 350 degrees for 1 hours or until toothpick inserted into the center comes out clean. Cool in pan for 10 minutes. Turn out onto cooling rack or towel. Elthea Spahr
