Pastor Dave's Corner:

My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? Why are you so far from helping me, from the words of my groaning? O my God, I cry by day, but you do not answer; and by night but find no rest. I am poured out like water, and all my bones are out of joint; my heart is like wax; it is melted within my breast; my mouth is dried up like a potsherd, and my tongue sticks to my jaws; you lay me in the dust of death. But you, O LORD, do not be far away! O my help, come quickly to my aid!—(Psalm 22:1-2, 14-15, 19, NRSV)

I don't know about you but it seems to me we're reminded of the Christmas season earlier and earlier each year. I remember I was in Hobby Lobby and Michael's in October, before Halloween, looking for some things for the All Saints Service and already, both places were stocked full of Christmas decorations. In fact, Hobby Lobby was having a 40% off sale on Christmas items. Needless to say, the area around all the Christmas stuff was mobbed!

And then there's Hallmark. I know, some of you love the Hallmark Channel and its Countdown to Christmas but there's something about it all starting in early November. To me, it seems like we're in a rush to Christmas.

In the church, the season of Christmas last for 12 days. The period leading up to it, Advent, lasts for 4 weeks. Advent is a season of preparation for Christ's coming. I don't mean just preparing to celebrate Christmas, Christ's incarnation and birth, his first coming, but it is also a time to prepare for Christ's return, his second coming. It is also a time of reflection, spiritual growth, and embracing the hope and promise in Christ Jesus. There is a three-fold purpose to the season. Advent invites us to slow

down, to resist the cultural temptation to jump ahead to Christmas, and to wait patiently on the Lord.

This year, in particular, I sense there are a number of folks in our congregations and neighboring communities who are patiently waiting on the Lord to come to their aid, to lift their cloud of darkness, sorrow, or despair. Whether due to the loss of a loved one, the loss of their health or that of a loved one, the loss of a job, a relationship, or the loss of joy or peace in their life, the Christmas and holiday season may not be joyful or joy-filled. Yet, our culture often expects folks to put on a cheerful smile when all they want to do is grieve.

This Advent Season, we will be hosting a "Longest Night," sometimes known as "Blue Christmas," service on Thursday, December 21 at 7:00 pm at Jennings Chapel. As the name of the service suggests, on the longest night of the year when the darkness is at its greatest and some experience overwhelming pain, this service acknowledges that the Christmas/holiday season isn't always a season of joy. In this service, there will be singing appropriate to the season, time to meditate on the pain and anguish we bring, and offer it to the Christ Child. It's a service of reflection, contemplation, and healing.

All are invited. I encourage you to share this opportunity with others, particularly those who are experiencing grief, sorrow, loss, health concerns, or other life challenges. It's a safe space to weep and morn, to laugh and cry. I hope to see some of you and your friends there.



Please join me for a Lenten Study, *The Gospel of Mark:* A Beginner's Guide to the Good News, by Amy-Jill Levine, a professor of New Testament at Vanderbilt University. This study will explore the Bible's earliest

source for the life of Jesus, examine John the Baptizer, the Little Apocalypse, the Transfiguration, and several of Jesus's most notable stories and parables. We'll see Jesus as divine and human, powerful and weak, approachable yet mysterious as we study the Good News of the Gospel of Mark with Amy-Jill. The book features an in-depth study of select passages and illuminates the Gospel in its historical context and as a source for the other gospels.

The study will begin Wednesday, February 21 at 6:30 pm for six consecutive weeks. If you're interested, please let the office know by Thursday, January 25 so we can order materials. Sessions will be done through ZOOM.


