And he was transfigured before them, and his face shone like the sun, and his clothes became dazzling white. Suddenly there appeared to them Moses and Elijah, talking with him. Then Peter said to Jesus, "Lord, it is good for us to be here; if you wish, I will make three dwellings here, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." (Mt 17:1-4)



If we hold onto that memory, it can sustain us as we go on in spite of life's challenges trusting that one day, we will experience the fullness and permanence of that glorious experience as we come face to face with Jesus Christ on that final day. As we come to the close of another church year, Advent starts November 28, lets us take a moment to reflect on the past year. It's been a rough one for many but for some, it's also held mountaintop moments. The tough times can help us appreciate the good times that much more. Savor those moments and let them encourage you for another New Year with its blessings yet to be revealed. Let us not lose faith in our hope and savior, Christ Jesus, and what he has in store for us.
